This past year has seen our u3a continue to flourish as a local group for mutual learning, community engagement, and friendship. The enthusiasm and participation of our members has been inspiring, and I am delighted to share the progress, highlights, and future news of our Interest Groups.

Our u3a now boasts 22 active Interest Groups, reflecting an impressive range of hobbies and subjects—spanning languages, the arts, walking, sports, and beyond. These are held in venues around Shepton Mallet. Each group is coordinated by a dedicated leader. Sometimes the other members share the leader's role enabling everyone to have ownership of the Group.
